

I thank the Lord for enabling me to stay, work, minister, and serve in the field for one year now. God is able! Where God guides, He provides.

Thank you, my co-laborers in the Gospel, for your faithful prayers and support. You've been there in my highest and lowest moments in the ministry. There were different types of challenges that we've faced and thank you for holding the rope, so I could launch out into the deep to rescue souls.

God allowed me to enter Costa Rica again, without any problems with the immigration. I felt downhearted knowing this would be my last entry this year as I could no longer extend my stay. My goal is to stay longer but because of the limited accessibility that we have and the requirements that the government of Costa Rica demands, I have to go back to the Philippines to gather all the documents needed for me to stay permanently or longer in the field. Deep inside my heart, I don't want to go back to the Philippines yet but I have to do things properly and legally. I will be leaving the country on October 18, 2024. Please pray for a safe flight and God's provision as I go back to the Philippines.

By God's grace, since the time we came here, though there were difficult times, we never stopped reaching the people with the Gospel. The last few months have been quite difficult as the attendance declined but since June, the attendance increased and by God's grace, it continues to increase. We had 4 baptisms last August and numerous people professed their faith every week. We faithfully go out, knock on doors, hand out tracts, visit new believers, and teach kids at least 4 times a week. Every week we see people getting saved. Almost every Sunday morning service we have first-time visitors and they are responding to the Gospel. Some of them go back, most of them not. It's painful to witness these things but we always trust that the work is God's and we are just instruments to sow the seed of the Gospel. All efforts and service will be reaped someday in heaven!

This month will be a very busy month for us. We are working hard to improve our place of worship for the 2nd Church Mission Anniversary and Missions Conference on September 19-22. Also, Pastor Juan Pastrana and I are teaming up to boost the faith of the brethren for missions. We have a campaign to win and invite people to Church. We are both preparing and encouraging members to be involved not only to reach the world but also to evangelize our community for Christ. Please pray that God will continue to work in the lives of our people and that He will use this country to advance the Gospel of Jesus. Is it possible? Sure, it is. But it takes hard work, dedication, time and faith. What an honor to serve God! I pray that God will call more missionaries to Costa Rica.I truly appreciate your prayers and love as we pursue the greatest endeavor in this world. I am praying for you and may the Lord use you more to bring the Gospel to the world.
